Working out Costs

Example for a large AHT:

Replacement cost \$35,000,000

Daily cost, say: \$17,000

Finance cost, say: \$1,500

Crew Costs: \$ 6,000

Maintenance: \$ 1,000

Fuel/Lubs: \$ 6,000

Operating Cost \$31,500 plus

Opportunity Cost



How Useful is Scopic?

- Pre-Agreed daily rates
- Does not reflect whole cost
- Not applicable in pure salvage
- No reflection of risk
- Does not take into account peril/sacrifice
- No weighting for attributable benefits


